ARE YOU SAFE SPORT TRAINED?

All competing members **age 18 or older** must complete **SafeSport training** in order to be eligible for US Equestrian activities, including competitions. IS YOUR HORSE MICROCHIPPED?

All competing horses are required by the United States Equestrian Federation to have a **compliant ISO 11784/11785 microchip**. If your horse's microchip has not been registered yet, simply fill out and submit the **USEF Microchip Reporting form**. The Park staff is able to scan your horse to determine the microchip number associated with it if you need assistance.

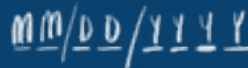

DID YOU PACK PROOF OF MEASUREMENT?

If you'll be showing in **height-restricted classes** and have a measurement card, put your proof of measurement somewhere where you'll be sure to take it with you to a competition, too. Remember that you also can get your horse's proof of measurement at www.usef.org. Go to your **Member Dashboard**, scroll down to My Horses, and click the ruler symbol immediately beside the horse's name.

IS YOUR HUNTER OR JUMPER'S AGE VERIFIED?

Planning to enter a **Young Hunter age-restricted jumper class** or participate in our new **2 EX Young Horse Program***? You'll need to have your horse or pony's age verified with USEF. To do this, you will need registration papers or a passport issued by a bred registry that is **recognized by USEF**.

**Age must be verified with USEF in order to qualify for discounted stall fees.*
