STALL RESERVATIONS

2023 Stall Reservation Policy for all Paso Park-Managed Horse Shows

Stall reservation for the 2023 September - November horse shows will open at 9 a.m. PST on Thursday, June 15, 2023.

Please submit and modify stall reservations through eq.Metrik.com. By completing a reservation you acknowledge that you accept the full financial responsibility of the reservations you make on your behalf individually, or on the behalf of yourself and your training clients. Stall reservations and information can be found at pasorobleshorsepark.com/2023stall-reservations/. Updates can be made to your reservation at any point prior to the stall confirmation deadline by logging into your eq.Metrik account, by texting (805) 369-1323 or by emailing stalls@pasorobleshorsepark.com.

By the related stall confirmation deadline for each show, you will be notified if your reservation can be accommodated or if you are on a waitlist for that show. The following outlines your financial commitment and fees related to stall reservations:

- Prior to the stall confirmation deadline: No financial penalties for reducing or canceling your total stall reservation
- The stall confirmation deadline through the entry closing date: You are financially responsible for the full cost of the total number of stalls most recently requested.
- After entry closing date: You are financially responsible for the full cost of the total number of stalls most recently requested and a \$50 office fee per stall reserved.

If your stall needs change after that deadline you may work with other trainers to take those stalls, HOWEVER:

- Exchanges of stalls between trainers must be communicated to the Paso Park staff <u>in</u> <u>writing</u> for final approval and must include both trainers on the communication
- Any exchanges made between trainers less than 10 days before the start of the show may not be accounted for in the stall chart
- If there is any misunderstanding between trainers as to who is responsible for the stall cost, it will be the trainer that had them originally reserved that is ultimately responsible for the stalls

If something does change please don't hesitate to reach out to us as soon as possible. The above language outlines the policy we follow, but with advanced notice, we will always try to work with trainers as best we can while maintaining a fair approach for all competitors.

REFUNDS

In the case that you will no longer be able to attend the horse show, please refer to the chart below to determine if you owe outstanding fees or will be receiving refunds.

We appreciate your efforts to help us be organized in preparing for the shows allowing us to accommodate as many competitors as possible. Should an unforeseen circumstance arise, please do not hesitate to reach out to management to discuss the details and determine if an exception can be made.



\$2,500 Open Hunter Classic

October 13 | November 17

All competitors will compete in the first round over a course of at least ten fences at 2'6" in height with up to four higher height options of 2'9"-2'11". The first round will be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. Once the judge's score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped.

At the conclusion of the first round, the top 10 riders will be invited back for a "pick-your-line" handy round. Riders must **create and ride a course of six to nine fences**, selecting the handy elements that they feel will best demonstrate the strengths of their horse. The second round will be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. The course may include up to four higher height option fences of 2'9"-2'11". All jumps, including those that were part of a high option in the first round, are considered individual fences and may be jumped as such (meaning if there was a high

option for a jump in the first round, and you would normally only jump one of the options in the first round, you may jump both in the handy round and have it considered as two fences). Competitors will be given a blank course map at the time of the walk; they must indicate the planned second round course on this map and turn it in prior to starting their first round. The judge will be given the maps so he/she is able to determine if the competitor is completing the intended round. Once the judge's score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped. All fences in the second round are to be jumped at normal canter pace unless a different gait is specifically noted by the course designer on the course map.

The combined score from round one and round two will determine overall score and placement in the class.

Note: Open Hunter Classic will not count for USEF points.

SPECIAL CLASSES

\$2,500 Speed Stake

October 14 | November 18

Order of go will be posted at least one hour prior to the start of the class. Competitors must appear in order of the posted order of go. All competitors must submit their bios in the horse show office by no later than Noon on the day of the class.

Competition will be held over a minimum of eight fences at a height of **1.15m**. The class is judged in USEF Table III, faults converted to time.

PARK SPECS

Adds & Scratches

Entries into and scratches from any classes should be conducted in the horse show office by **5:00 p.m. the day before** to avoid any Add/Scratch Fees or forfeiture of your entry fee. Entries made after this time will be considered "same day" and will only be accepted if the schedule is not full. Same day entries may go first in the order, regardless of when the order is drawn. Scratches made after this time are considered "same day" and will be addressed as follows: Unless otherwise specified, same day adds and/or scratches will incur a fee of \$5 per transaction. Classes with less than six (6) entries at 5:00 p.m. the day before may be canceled or combined at management's discretion. Management will take USEF and USHJA Zone 10 rules into consideration when making choices related to combining or splitting classes.

Hunter Classics

Horses or ponies must have competed in at least two classes of the related section. Unless specified otherwise, the final round over fences in each section is to count as the first round of the respective classic. All hunter rounds will be scored under the open numerical judging system. If a horse is not present for either the first or second round of a classic, that horse will receive a zero score in that round. Scores will be totaled from both the first and second round to determine the winners. All overall ties will be broken by using second round scores. Classes 21 and 22 the Junior/AO Hunter Classics and 20 the Child/Adult Hunter Classic will not be eligible for Horse of the Year bonus points. Prize money divided 30%, 20%, 15%, 13%, 12%, 10%.

Paso Park Medal

Hosted at the Paso Park Schooling Show Series, the Paso Park B Series, and other regional shows, the Paso Park Medal features fences not to exceed 3' in height. A minimum of two riders must complete the course in order for the round to qualify for points. The top four riders (if available) in the class may be asked to work off at the judge's discretion. Alternatively, the course designer may choose to integrate the test(s) into the posted course. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1-17. This class may be run in either a jumper or hunter competition arena; jumperstyle tack is permitted, no time allowed is to be considered. This class is open to all junior and amateur riders. Riders may not cross enter in the Lindsay Ashburn Memorial Green Rider Medal. Finals of the Paso Park Medal will be held at the Turkey Trot & Jump show. Points from shows hosting the medal between December 1 of the previous year through October 31 of the current year or at the Turkey Trot & Jump show are eligible to qualify a rider for the Finals. Points are to be awarded as follows: 1st - 7pts, 2nd - 5pts, 3rd - 4pts, 4th - 3pts, 5th - 2pts, 6th - 1pt. Riders with 7 points or more are invited to participate in the Paso Park Medal Final. Any rider that has previously won the Paso Park 3' Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.

Lindsay Ashburn Memorial Green Rider Medal

Hosted at the Paso Park Schooling Show Series, the Paso Park B Series, and other regional shows, the Green Rider Medal features fences not to exceed 2' in height. Class is to be held over a hunter-style equitation style. A minimum of two riders must complete the course in order for the round to qualify for points. The top four riders (if available) in the class may be asked to work off at the judge's discretion. Alternatively, the course designer may choose to integrate the test(s) into the posted course. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1-6 and 10-13. This class is open to all junior and amateur riders who have not competed at heights above 3'. Riders may not cross enter in the Paso Park Medal. Finals of the Green Rider Medal will be held at the Turkey Trot & Jump show. Points from shows hosting the medal between December 1, of the previous year through October 31, of the current year or at the Turkey Trot & Jump show are eligible to qualify a rider for the Finals. Points are to be awarded as follows: 1st - 7pts, 2nd - 5pts, 3rd - 4pts, 4th -3pts, 5th - 2pts, 6th - 1pt. Riders with 7 points or more are invited to participate in the Green Rider Medal Final. Any rider that has previously won the Green Rider Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.

English Pleasure Hunter Seat Classes

Forward, balance seat or side saddle, snaffle bridle, pelham with two reins, kimberwicke bits or a full bridle (curb and snaffle). If a full bridle is used, it must be of hunter-style and excessive length of curb shank shall be penalized. Breast plates are permissible, but martingales are prohibited. Horses may be shown with or without braided manes and/or tails. For rider, traditional hunter-style jacket, breeches or hunter jodhpurs, dark hunting cap, derby, or protective headgear and appropriate boots. Tall dress or tall field boots are preferred as traditional. Paddock or jodhpur boots with matching half chaps are permitted although not considered as traditional. A stock, choker or four in hand with any color shirt is correct. In all classes gloves, hunter crop or bat, and spurs are optional. Riders must wear fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society of Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag (See GR801.4) when mounted. Shadbellies are prohibited.

Pumpkin Power, Plop & Speed

Riders are asked to jump a course of 4 fences set at 0.70m. After each fence, the rider must plop a piece of candy into the Jack-o-Lanterns without dropping the candy or knocking over the bucket. Any fallen rails, candies, or buckets are 4 faults converted to time. The fastest time wins. All can participate, but only juniors and amateurs can win!

Turkey Dinner Relay

Follow the course map to jump 4-6 jumps with 3-4 buffet stations in between to build your dinner basket. To complete the relay you must return to the back gate with a full plate containing all Thanksgiving dinner items listed on the course map. Faults are calculated based on standard jumper rules and four faults will be added for each missing dinner item. Fastest time with lowest faults wins. All can participate, but only juniors and amateurs can win!

RULES & REGULATIONS

- » All entries must be postmarked by Closing Day deadlines noted on page 4 with all required numbers and signatures to receive early entry status.
- » Late Fee Entries received after Closing Day will be charged a \$50 office fee.
- » Payment All payments should be paid by credit card, cash, or check made payable to Paso Robles Horse Park Foundation. Any checks returned by the bank will be charged a \$100 penalty or 10% of the face value of the check, whichever is greater.
- » Open Balances Competitors who do not come into the office to close out at the end of the show forfeit the right to adjustments on any show charges. Final balances will be automatically charged to the payment method on file.
- » Past Credits/Balances Competitors may be notified of any previous Paso Park activity at the time of check-in. Outstanding balances must be paid prior to picking up show numbers. Outstanding balances may be deducted from prize money payments.
- » Trainer Splits Trainers may choose to add tack/grooming, feed and bedding orders, RV reservations, competitor show expenses, or any other miscellaneous show purchases to their "trainer splits." Trainers have until 5 p.m. on Friday of the show to complete the trainer split form indicating which competitor accounts to apply the division of expenses to and how to apply the division. If they do not complete this form by the deadline, the office may charge the full amount to the trainer's payment on file. It is fully and solely the trainer's responsibility to indicate what items are applicable to the split and how it should be applied. By completing and submitting your entry form with the indicated trainer's name on it, you accept the responsibility to accept any assigned splits from that trainer for all costs related to the show you are entering. The horse show management is not able to intervene in a trainer's direction of how to assign those expenses.
- » Same Day Entry & Scratch Fees Any same day adds or scratches will be charged a late entry fee of \$5 per transaction. Once the class has begun a competitor cannot add or scratch from that class unless exception is made by management.
- » Photo & Video Consent By competing at or attending competitions or events at the Paso Robles Horse Park, you grant permission to unrestricted rights to use photographs and/or video footage of you, your horse, your pets, your family, and/or your guests for the purpose of promotion of the Paso Park in various mediums.
- » Park Safety & Surveillance In an effort to protect horses, competitors and the safety of the Paso Park, certain areas of the facility are under video/sound/photo surveillance. By competing at or attending competitions at the Paso Robles Horse Park you authorize any surveillance of your activities while on the premises. The Paso Robles Horse Park is responsible for the management of the surveillance system and has exclusive control of the release of video/audio/images.
- » The Park is a Non-Smoking Facility. Please refrain from smoking or use of any vape products while on the facility.
- » Stalls Stalls on-site are 12' x 12' with Dutch doors. Stalls have rubber mat flooring. Each stall has access to electricity and there are four water spickets in each stall aisle. Due to the unpredictable nature of the industry, stall assignments aren't finalized until 72 hours before the first day of competition. We do our best to accommodate all requests, but are constrained by various factors. Stalls are assigned based on previous attendance at Paso Park-managed shows, barn size, and our ability to maximize the use of these stalls.
- » Show Scratches Up until the stall confirmation date or, you may make changes to or cancel your entries and related stall reservations. After that point you are fully responsible for the stall fee related to each specific horse's entry and after entry closing date you are also responsible for a \$50 office fee. At management's discretion entry fees will be refunded in full, less a \$50 office charge, with veterinary certificate or medical

- doctors note submitted via email at least 48 hours prior to the start of the shows first judged class. For more information on refunds and show scratches, refer to page 6 of this prize list.
- » Feed, Shavings and Grain The Paso Robles Horse Park Feed Office will be open during show dates and will be offering hay, shavings, and grain feed. For advance orders please email feed@PasoRoblesHorsePark.com or complete the online feed form. Orders can also be made at the show in the office. Please note there will be no same day grain deliveries. Competitors may bring their own feed and bedding but they may not receive a feed or bedding delivery from an outside company.
- » Statement of Health/Vaccinations Per GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule: At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Competitors may be asked to provide proof of vaccination upon check-in or prior to entering the property.
- » Dogs All dogs at the Paso Robles Horse Park must be on a leash or tied at all times. There will be a \$50 penalty for any dogs off-leash or owners who do not pick up after their dogs.
- » Arenas All sand arenas at the Paso Robles Horse Park contain premier GGT Footing. The grass on the main turf field is a hybrid Bermuda called GN-1, specifically used for athletic purposes. The show and warm-up arenas measure as follows:

> LD Hayes Grand Prix Arena: 190' x 260'

> Fairway Grand Hunter Field: 175' x 300'

> Butterfield Arena: 150' x 275' > JW Arena: 150' x 275'

> Oak Grove Arena: 140' x 255'

> Warm-Up Arenas #1 & #2: 140' x 230'

> Fairway Warm-Up: 130' x 220'

> Warm-Up Arena #3: 100' x 230'

> Warm-Up Arena #4: 130' x 220'

- » Judging Criteria To be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise stated.
- » Handy Hunter For indicated hunter sections and divisions one class will feature a handy course. This course will be the second over fences class in each indicated section.
- » Attire It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may, at its discretion, bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. If competing in any judged class, riders must wear a hunt coat or a shirt with a collar, breeches and tall boots.
- » Cell Phones Active use of cell phones and all cellular transmission devices is not permitted in any competition or warm-up arena.
- » Jumping Order Orders of go will be established by the back gate personnel. Management and show staff may change the order at any time. These orders will be established by either computer or manual draw.
- » Ties In the event of a tie, both will be awarded the placing tied for, unless otherwise stated.
- » Championships Champion and Reserve Champion to be awarded as per current USEF rules. Points for placings to be awarded 1st-10, 2nd-6, 3rd-4, 4th-2, 5th-1, 6th-1/2.
- » Warm-Up Rounds The day prior to the start of the competition, ticketed schooling with assigned times will take place in all competition rings at \$20/ticket. A schedule will be posted noting the height changes. Competitor numbers must be worn during schooling. Additional warm-

up classes have been included in the schedule during competition days. No poling or offsets allowed.

- » Lunging Lunging is only permitted in the two designated lunging arenas. There is no mounted riding or schooling of any sort of jumps permitted in the lunging arenas. There is a \$500 fine for lunging in non-designated arenas. Footing in these areans is comprised of mesa sand footing.
- Awards Trophies/prizes to first, ribbons through 6th place and, unless otherwise stated in this prize list, prize money divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%. Prize money will be awarded at time of check-out and applied to entry fees or mailed within 30 days of the show to the contact noted on entries. If an awards ceremony is conducted, all ribbon winners are required to attend and participate. Failure to participate in awards ceremony without explicit permission from management may result in forfeiture of related prize money, and any prizes or ribbons. A valid social security or federal tax ID number must be provided to receive any prize money, either credited to your account or in the form of a check. Individuals that do not provide current and accurate information in the prize money section of the entry form acknowledge that they may not receive winnings in a timely manner. Paso Park staff will make reasonable efforts to contact the payee for information. However, if after 12 months following the last day of the competition prize money hasn't been collected, prize money may be forfeited.
- » Schooling No juniors or amateurs are allowed to school over fences without their trainer in the arena.
- » Helmets All professionals and non-professionals riding on the Park property must wear securely fastened protective headgear, which meets ASTM/SEI standards and carries the SEI tag. Any rider violating this rule at any time will immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.
- » EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- » Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show, the officials, contractors and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his/ her horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
- » The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries, and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.
- » Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the management, judges or officials, on the part of the owner, trainer, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit entry fee and other fees.
- » Text Alerts All trainers will be automatically enrolled in text updates utilizing the contact information submitted with entries. At the start of the show there will be an introductory text that allows the opportunity to opt-out.
- » Non-Competing Horses All horses on the grounds must be entered to compete in classes. If you are not planning to show, a \$150 noncompeting fee will apply. All horses on the grounds will be assigned a number. To be considered a competing horse, an entry must be shown in a judged class.
- » Timer Walks Timer walks may be permitted, but only with advanced permission from management before the start of the class. If a timer walk is utilized to qualify for the related classic, the competitor will be responsible for paying the full cost of competing in every class in that

section.

- » Non-Comp/Hors Concours Round Unjudged rounds may be permitted, but only at management's discretion. In the situation where a round is permitted, the cost will be the full price of a related normal competition round.
- » RDNE Fee It is the full responsibility of the competitor and trainer to ensure they have properly entered any and all classes they intend to compete in. A "ride-did-not-enter" (RDNE) fee of \$25 will be added in addition to the cost of the class for any rounds competed that cannot be supported by office-approved paperwork.
- » Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any trainer, competitor, groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.
- » Medical Waste In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.
- » No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.
- » Ties for other than first place to be broken by time taken in the first round
- » Trailer Parking All trailers must be parked in the designated trailer parking lot near the entrance of the Park. Any trailer not parked in the correct location may have its hitch locked and may be applicable to a \$50 fee.
- » Prize Money Classes awarding prize money must have at least three entries complete the course to pay, unless otherwise specified by USEF rules. If there are less than three competitors, the management may choose to still run the class with or without prize money or combine the class with another. In the instance of combined classes, the lower prize money and class entry fee will be utilized unless otherwise specified by management.
- » Emergency Care Twin Cities Community Hospital Emergency Room is 11 miles away from the Paso Park at 1100 Las Tablas Road, Templeton, CA 93465.
- » Level 1 Trauma Center Community Regional Medical Center is 109 miles away from the Paso Park at 2823 Fresno Street, Fresno, CA 93721.
- » Safe Sport All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.
- » All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.
- » Hunter Prize Money The total amount of rated and unrated hunter prize money being offered at the competition (\$10,700), the minimum amount of guaranteed rated and unrated hunter prize money payout (\$0.00), and the total amount of rated and unrated hunter prize money offered (\$10,000) and paid out by the competition in the prior year (not applicable due to all new licenses).

IMPORTANT POLICIES OF THE SHOW

Adds & Scratches Due By 5 p.m. Daily

All changes for the next day, including adds and scratches, must be made by 5 p.m. each day in the office. This allows the next day's schedule to be created with class counts and times, and made available to everyone in a timely manner. These shows allow same-day adds as long as the schedule in each ring allows for such. Any changes made after 5 p.m., if accepted, will be considered SAME DAY and will fall under the policy for same day adds and scratches. There will be a \$5 per transaction fee for late entries and scratches.

Same-Day Ads & Scratches

Any same day adds or scratches must first be done at the show office. Once add/scratch forms are completed with office, slips must be brought to the backgate. If any same day scratches are not done in the office before the start of the class, that class will not be removable from the show bill.

Canceling & Combining Of Classes

Classes with less than the entry minimums may be either canceled or combined with other classes, at management's discretion. Often this is determined at 5 p.m. the day prior to the class. Please enter in all your desired classes by 5 p.m. the day before.

Scratch Your Classes BEFORE They Start

Be sure to stop by the Horse Show Office or utilize <u>horseshowing.com</u> to scratch any classes you have entered that you won't be showing in BEFORE the start of the class. If you don't scratch them at all, or try to scratch them after the class has started, you will be charged the full entry fee.

Posted Time Schedule

The most accurate estimation of the daily time schedule will be completed after adds and scratches have been entered. We strive to post this schedule by 7 p.m. the day prior. The schedule can be found at www.PasoRoblesHorsePark.com/Daily-Show-Schedule.

MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active, and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice devision; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

SCHOOLING POLICIES

L.D. Hayes Grand Prix Arena Schooling Policy

No schooling or riding is permitted in L.D. Hayes Grand Prix Arena during the show week. Exceptions may be made, but only with management's permission.

Fairway Hunter Field Schooling Policy

Each morning of the show week the arena will be open for hand-walking from sunrise until 30 minutes before the scheduled start time. This may be canceled or modified if weather dictates. No schooling or riding is allowed in this arena during the show week.

Oak Grove, JW & Butterfield Arenas Schooling Policy

Each morning the arena is hosting judged classes it will be open from sunrise until 45 minutes before the scheduled start time for hacking only, no jumping. Following the completion and reset at the end of each show day, schooling over fences after the course has been reset may be permitted at management's discretion.

Schooling & Warm-Up Policies

"Ticketed Warm-Ups" are held on Wednesday in L.D. Hayes Arena, Butterfield Arena, Fairway Hunter Field, and JW Arena. In Oak Grove Arena, "ticketed warm-ups" will be held on Thursday and Friday. The intent of these is to allow introduction to the competition space in advance of the show, it is not to host extensive schooling or teaching of lessons in the show rings; please plan to utilize the warm-up rings for those activities. Each round may be up to 5 minutes long and can be utilized for hacking or jumping portions of the posted course. There is no changing of jump heights or directions allowed. Only one trainer per five minute window at a time, the back gate will announce a 30 second warning to the conclusion of your time, if you continue to ride past that 30 seconds, an additional ticketed round will be charged to your entry. Everyone riding a ticketed warm-up must wear a number. All rounds will be billed to the number recorded; however, trainers may choose to wear a single number throughout the day and have all ticketed warm-up charges included on the trainer split. No poling or offsets allowed. Once the show week begins on Thursday of each week the above policies will take effect in each specified arena.

Please note all schooling access is subject to weather, footing and schedule constraints as determined by show management. Absolutely no schooling will be permitted 30 minutes after sunset each day. Any end-of-day over fences schooling must be confirmed with management through back gate staff.

All Outreach riders are invited to our Outreach Education Hour each Saturday evening at the close of Oak Grove Arena. We are excited to offer a chance to sit down with USEF Judge James Waldman for feedback on their rounds that day and opportunities for improvement on their Sunday rounds.



ABOUT THE JUDGE

James Waldman has been training and judging in California since 1989. In 2004, he became the owner and head trainer at Quail Haven Farm in Bonsall. James serves on the USHJA Zone 10 Committee, the USHJA Adult Horsemanship Committee, and as President of the Greater San Diego Hunter Jumper Association.

Over the years, he has judged various Medal Finals including Orange County, Santa Barbara, Los Angeles IEL, Legis, Boise, Tuscan, and the 2020 CPHA Foundation Finals. He currently travels as a clinicion and "R" USEF Judge.

OUTREACH RULES & REGULATIONS

Only juniors or amateurs may compete in any Outreach classes, including warm-up classes. Non-Comp/Hon Concours rounds are not permitted unless permission is given at management's discretion.

All courses will have at least seven jumps and no combinations are allowed. For each section, only the first three numbered over fences classes, regardless of how many classes are held, and one under saddle class in each hunter section will count for USHJA Outreach points.

Equitation

All courses will have at least seven jumps and no combinations are allowed. For each section, only the first three numbered over fences classes, regardless of how many classes are held, and one flat class in each equitation section will count for USHJA Outreach points. Riders must be juniors or amateurs.

Points

- · At least three entries must complete the course or class for points to count
- Points will accrue through sixth place for any class that has six or more entries
 - » In classes with six or more entries, full points will accrue as follows: 10-6-4-2-1-1/2
 - » 5 entries: 6-4-2-1-1/2
 - » 4 entries: 4-2-1-1/2
 - » 3 entries: 2-1-1/2
- · A rider's home zone will be determined by their place of residence during the current competition year. If a rider changes zones, because of school, work, or otherwise, he/she must request permission change his/her home zone to the USHJA in writing in order for his/her points to follow. Points will follow the USHJA competition year, December 1 to November 30.
- USHJA will provide certificates of merit in three categories in each USHJA Outreach section or class.
 - 1. Bronze Level: riders must earn at least 30 points during the competition year
 - 2. Silver Level: riders must earn at least 50 points during the competition year
 - 3. Gold Level: riders must earn at least 75 points during the competition year
 - 4. Certificates will be awarded by zone, and if a zone banquet is held the zone committee is strongly encouraged to present USHJA Outreach certificates during the banquet. Otherwise certificates will be mailed. When a rider achieves Bronze the USHJA will mail the certificate at that time. Presentations of Silver and Gold certificates will be awarded at the end of the year.

Membership Requirements

- · Outreach Membership is free. All Outreach class participants must join as a USHJA Outreach member to be eligible for awards.
- Horses are not required to be registered with USHJA or be microchipped to compete in Outreach classes.
- · Outreach members are subject to a Show Pass Fee of \$30 at USEF licensed events.
